DEFENDANT'S EXPERT DISCLOSURE

Defendant Jesse Brooks, by and through counsel, hereby submits the following disclosure regarding experts pursuant to Superior Court Rules 35(f) and 98:

I. Dr. Alan A. Wartenberg, M.D.

1. Dr. Alan A. Wartenberg, M.D., 3 Prince Street, Attleboro, Massachusetts 02703, is a licensed physician and professor of medicine. Dr. Wartenberg specializes in the study and treatment of the effects of use and abuse of drugs and alcohol, as well as the study and treatment of substance addiction. A copy of Dr. Wartenberg's curriculum vitae, which details his education, experience, qualifications, and expertise, is attached at Tab 1.

2. Counsel for Defendant expect that Dr. Wartenberg, if called as a witness at trial, will testify regarding the potential effects of drug and alcohol use by Michael Benton on Mr. Benton's testimony regarding events at issue in this case. The discovery that the State has produced in this case to date has included multiple statements made by Mr. Benton to law enforcement and/or counsel for the State in which Mr. Benton has admitted extensive use of illicit drugs and alcohol. In addition, Mr. Benton testified during a deposition in this case (June 19, 2008) and during the trial of co-defendant John A. "Jay" Brooks (Sep. 16, 2008) regarding his extensive use of illicit drugs and alcohol.

3. Counsel for Defendant expect that Dr. Wartenberg will testify, based on his experience and expertise, regarding the potential psychoactive effects of drug and alcohol use like that which Mr. Benton has previously acknowledged. Defense counsel expect that such testimony would include testimony that (1) cocaine use may result in paranoia, delusions, confusion, and disorientation; (2) that alcohol use may impair a witness's memory; (3) that combined use of cocaine and alcohol may have a synergistic effect by which use of each increases the effects of the other; and (4) that marijuana use may impair a sense of timing.¹

II. Dr. Ronald P. Fisher, Ph.D.

4. Dr. Ronald P. Fisher, Ph.D., is a professor of psychology at Florida International University, 3000 N.E. 151st Street, North Miami, Florida 33181-3600, and is on the faculty of the university's Legal Psychology Program. Dr. Fisher specializes in the study of memory, particularly in the context of witness testimony. A copy of Dr. Fisher's curriculum vitae, which details his education, experience, qualifications, and expertise, is attached at Tab 2.

5. Counsel for Defendant expect that Dr. Fisher, if called as a witness at trial, will testify based on his experience and expertise regarding ways in which the memories of witnesses Joseph Vrooman and Michael Benton may be susceptible to the incorporation of events that the witness did not actually experience, and the factors that may increase the susceptibility of a witness's memory to this process. Defense counsel expects that Dr. Fisher will also testify regarding the ways in which questioning by police or prosecutors may increase a witness's potential to remember events that the witness did not actually experience. Defense counsel expect that Dr. Fisher will also testify regarding the increase in confidence that a witness may have regarding that witness's memory of a particular event as a result of repeated questioning

about the event, as well as the increased consistency in a witness's memory of an event that may also result from such repeated questioning.²

III. Paul Daubitz

6. Paul Daubitz, 10 Annapolis Way West, Newbury, Massachusetts 01951, holds a Master of Science Degree in Telecommunications and has over 40 years experience working in the telecommunications industry. He has specialized knowledge of and experience with a wide variety of telecommunications and information technology topics including wireless and landline call detail records, billing and usage analysis. A copy of Mr. Daubitz's resume, which details his education and experience relevant to his area of expertise, is attached at Tab 3.

7. Counsel for Defendant expect that Mr. Daubitz, if called as a witness at trial, will testify concerning the manner in which cellular/wireless data is collected by phone carriers and reported in call billing and other call detail records, as well as how that data is used to track the location of cell/wireless phones. In addition, Mr. Daubitz is expected to testify concerning landline telephone and related billing records.³

8. The discovery provided by the State in this case includes telephone records spanning several years for cellular telephones and landlines purportedly associated with a number of key witnesses in the case as well as the defendant himself and his co-defendants. While the State has identified a potential telecommunications expert in this case, it has failed to provide a summary of the facts and opinions to which the expert is expected to testify at trial and a summary of the grounds for each opinion, among other information required to be disclosed by the State pursuant to Superior Court Rule 98(C)(1) no later than July 1, 2009. The State has failed to identify the telephone records, relevant time periods of such records, and subscribers

that its telecommunications expert will rely upon to establish the charge of conspiracy against the Defendant. As a result, while counsel for the Defendant expects that Mr. Daubitz will testify, based on his experience and expertise, regarding the usage of certain cellular and landline telephones between and among relevant telephone subscribers, defense counsel is unable to provide a more detailed summary of the facts and opinions to which Mr. Daubitz will testify at this time until such time as the State identifies the telephone records that it contends are evidence of Jesse Brooks' alleged participation in the charged conspiracy. It is not enough in this case for the State to rely on the fact that their telecommunications expert testified previously during trials relating to Mr. Brooks' co-defendants as the telephone evidence relating to Mr. Brooks' alleged participation in the charged conspiracy is necessarily separate and distinct.

IV. Reservation of Rights

9. This expert disclosure is being made pursuant to the standing scheduling order in effect in this case. Defendant reserves the right to supplement and amend this disclosure, including the right to retain additional experts, in light of information that may be disclosed subsequent to this filing.

10. Defendant also reserves the right to call as witnesses and elicit information and opinion testimony from any person who has knowledge and expertise relating to the issues raised in this case and who may have specific knowledge relating to the issues in this case. These witnesses have not been retained to provide expert testimony, nor do their duties regularly involve the giving of expert testimony.


11. Defendant also reserves the right to call as witnesses and elicit information and opinion testimony from each person identified in the State's expert disclosure, subsequent disclosures, or any person upon whom the State may rely as an expert witness. Defendant

reserves the right to elicit from such witnesses testimony on any of the issues in this case. By soliciting such potential testimony, Defendant would not and does not necessarily adopt or accept such opinions. This disclosure should not be interpreted as a waiver of Defendant's right to object to any expert testimony offered by the State.

12. Defendant also reserves the right to have its experts critique, comment on, and rebut the testimony and opinions of the State's experts. Defendant reserves the right to elicit from such witnesses testimony on any of the issues in this case without specifically adopting the testimony and opinions of the State or the State's experts.


