

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN AUTUMN SAVOY
AND THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In consideration for Autumn Savoy's acknowledgement of responsibility for his criminal conduct in Mont Vernon, New Hampshire, on or about October 3rd, 4th and 5th, 2009; and in consideration for his complete and truthful cooperation during the investigation of the murder of Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates, including any future prosecution of Christopher Gribble, William Marks, Quinn Glover and/or Steven Spader; and subject to the conditions set forth below, the State of New Hampshire ("the State"), by and through the Office of the Attorney General, enters into the following agreement with Autumn Savoy:

THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

1. The State will allow Autumn Savoy to plead guilty to one count of Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (Class B Felony) pursuant to RSA 642:3, a second count of Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (Class B Felony) pursuant to RSA 642:3, and one count of Conspiracy to Commit Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (Class B Felony) pursuant to RSA 629:3.
2. At the sentencing hearing on these charges, the State will recommend that the Hillsborough County Superior Court impose the following sentences:
 - (a) Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (Class B Felony) - Two and one half (2½) to six (6) years in the New Hampshire State Prison, stand committed.
 - (b) Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (Class B Felony) - Two and one half (2½) to six (6) years in the New Hampshire State Prison, stand committed and consecutive to the first Hindering Apprehension charge; and
 - (c) Conspiracy to Commit Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (Class B Felony) - Three and one half (3½) to seven (7) years in the New Hampshire State Prison. This sentence, if ever imposed, will be consecutive to both the two Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution charges, but suspended for ten (10) years on condition of good behavior, effective upon release from incarceration.
 - (d) The State further agrees that the above-imposed sentence shall run concurrently with any imposed deferred sentence at this time pending in the Nashua District Court with the Hollis Police Department.
3. Subject to the provisions of this agreement, the State will not seek any additional charges against Autumn Savoy arising out of the murder of Kimberly Cates

and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates as of the date of this agreement, as long as Autumn Savoy adheres to all of the conditions of this agreement.

THE OBLIGATIONS OF AUTUMN SAVOY


The above obligations on behalf of the State of New Hampshire are made subject to the following conditions:

- A. Autumn Savoy will accept full responsibility for his conduct in connection with the murder of Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates, including his actions in committing the crimes of Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (two counts) and Conspiracy to Commit Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution, referenced above. To that end, he will enter pleas of guilty to those offenses.
- B. Autumn Savoy will waive indictment in connection with the charges of Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution (two counts) and Conspiracy to Commit Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution.
- C. Autumn Savoy agrees to waive any right he may have to a speedy sentencing hearing, and further agrees that he may be sentenced after disposition of all criminal cases arising from the murder of Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates.
- D. At sentencing, Autumn Savoy will agree that the sentence recommended by the State of New Hampshire and set forth in paragraph 2 of this agreement is appropriate under all the circumstances attendant to this case. In the event that the Hillsborough County Superior Court does not impose the sentence recommended by the State pursuant to this agreement, both the State and Autumn Savoy retain their right to withdraw the plea agreement.
- E. During the pendency of the proceedings arising from the murder of Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates, including but not limited to the prosecution of Christopher Gribble, William Marks, Quinn Glover and/or Steven Spader for crimes arising out of the murder of Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates on or about October 4, 2009, Autumn Savoy must comply fully, truthfully, and in a timely manner with all reasonable requests of the State of New Hampshire within the scope of this agreement. All such cooperation must be completed in good faith and employ the best efforts of Autumn Savoy. The cooperation required of Autumn Savoy by this agreement includes all proceedings involving the State of New Hampshire arising from the murder of

Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates. A failure to so cooperate will constitute a breach of this agreement and release the State of New Hampshire from all of its obligations hereunder.


F. During the pendency of the proceedings described in paragraph E, Autumn Savoy must at all times in good faith provide information and testimony that is truthful, candid and complete. Knowingly making or having made a material false statement or omission, including, without limitation, during the original proffer, pretrial meetings, depositions, hearings or trial testimony, will constitute a breach of this agreement. In the event of such a breach, or any other breach of this agreement, the State of New Hampshire will be released from all of its obligations hereunder, and this agreement will become null and void. Upon a breach, as determined by the Hillsborough County Superior Court, the original charge may be reinstated, the State may institute any other new or additional appropriate charges supported by the evidence, and/or the State may increase its sentencing recommendation with regard to the charges referenced in this agreement. Further, the State may make full use of any sworn or unsworn statements or other information or evidence provided by Autumn Savoy for any purpose in any proceeding. Autumn Savoy also may be prosecuted to the full extent of the law for perjury or obstruction of justice or any other appropriate offense in the event that he knowingly makes a material false statement or omission to investigators or State's attorneys during any proceeding related to the murder of Kimberly Cates and/or the attempted murder of Jaimie Cates, including during proffers, meetings, or testimony before a grand jury, at deposition, or at trial in the course of fulfilling his obligations under this agreement.

This agreement constitutes the full and complete understanding between the parties. There shall be no modification to this agreement unless made in writing and signed by all the parties.








