



Directions: Have the students think about these questions before they watch the video and go on the Supreme Court tour. After returning from the tour give them worksheet to complete.

- 1 There are **5** justices on the NH Supreme Court.
- 2 The Supreme Court decisions in a case are explained in an essay written by one of the justices that is called an **opinion**.
- 3 A jury's decision is called a **verdict**.
- 4 You must be **18** years old to be a juror in New Hampshire.
- 5 **Family** court is the place where juveniles—that's a person under 16 years old--- comes if they are charged with a crime.
- 6 In the **Probate** Court you can officially change your name.
- 7 In Probate Court people that are appointed to help others are called **guardians**.
- 8 When a person dies, their **will** is filed in the probate court.
- 9 **Bailiffs** take care of prisoners who are on trial, they guard the jury and make sure that everyone is quiet and orderly in the courtroom.
- 10 The right to say what we want is called **free speech**.
- 11 **Oral argument** is what the hearing at the Supreme Court is called.
- 12 Everyone who comes into a courthouse in New Hampshire must go through **security**.
- 13 When everybody plays by the same rules and no one gets special treatment it is called **justice**.
- 14 Knowing about the courts is part of being a good **citizen**.
