VALIDATION OF AN ADOPTION

Items listed below are needed to start this type case:

One set of documents (listed below) must be filed for each adoptee. Petition for Validation of Adoption Finalized in a Foreign Country form (NHJB-2191-P). You must attach the required documentation that you checked off on question #4 on this petition. If requested, the original documents provided to validate the adoption will be returned to the petitioner after the court has ruled on the petition. Confidential Report of City and Town Clerk Relative to Adoption form (VS-37) See Probate Division Procedure Bulletin 24 if child entered the country prior to 1/22/2004. Other items that may be needed:: Photo identification may be required. How much will this cost? Filing Fee of **\$150.00** for each petition filed. What happens next? If a hearing is requested, you will receive a Notice of Hearing in the mail. This notice will inform you of the date, time and place of the hearing. All parties are required to attend the hearing. If a hearing is not requested, you will receive the Certificate of Adoption in the mail when the court approves the petition. When an adoption has been validated by a New Hampshire court, a NH Certificate of Foreign Birth is available only through the NH Division of Vital Records Administration (DVRA). The proper form and fee must be filed. The NH Division of Vital Records Administration (DVRA) is located at 71 South Fruit Street, Concord, NH 03301, (603) 271-4650.
